National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) testing will be conducted at Chisholm Catholic Primary on 9 - 11 May 2017 for all students in Years 3 & 5.

A reminder that any access to disability adjustments or exemptions from the tests need to be discussed with the Principal by Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May, as per the NAPLAN parent letter that went home last term.

#### APPLICATIONS FOR EXTENDED LEAVE

As you know it is very important that children attend school every day. Quite often leave is requested by parents for various reasons. While we understand that this may be necessary sometimes, it is not encouraged as every school day is important for every child.

If you intend taking your child out of school for five days or more you must make a formal application in writing to the Principal and fill out an application for extended leave which is available from the school office. It is important for you to know that, depending on circumstances, this leave may not be granted. Each application will be considered on an individual basis and could depend on circumstances such as the intention for the leave, your child's attendance, and the impact the leave may have on your child's academic progress.

These regulations are in place to make sure that your child achieves to his/her full potential and I know you will understand the reasoning behind them.

- 3 Select your child's class and school.

**4** - Click on **ORDER** and then **select the books** you would like to order.

5 - Make your **payment** using credit card.

Last Tuesday, we had a national holiday to commemorate ANZAC Day. We gave thanks for our peaceful country and celebrated our freedom. We honoured those who fought to protect our beautiful land.



We prayed for peace in our world, peace among people in our own country, peace in our families and peace in our hearts. We also prayed for those who are affected by war at this time.

Kemal Ataturk, the father of modern Turkey, wrote this to the Australian mothers about their sons, the Anzacs, who fought at Gallipoli:



"Those heroes that shed their blood and lost their lives... you are now lying in the soil of a friendly country. Therefore, rest in peace. There is no difference between the Johnnies and the Mehmets to us where they lie side by side here in this country of ours ... You, the mothers, who sent their sons from far away countries wipe away your tears, your sons are now lying in our bosom and are in peace. After having lost their lives on this land they have become our sons as well."



Last Friday we celebrated Jesus rising from the dead by coming together as Chisholm community for Mass. This was also a special occasion because it was Father Arthur's last Mass with us before he retires. Today we raised our right hand over Father and sang a blessing for him. We hope that he enjoys his retirement and thank him for his many faithful years as a parish priest. May God bless him and bring him joy and good health in his retirement.
