We have had a tremendous start to our school term. Our staff participated in rich professional learning on the first day back. This learning was around assessment and the variety of forms it takes.




On Tuesday we experienced our "Dive into Learning" day where we were

Dear Students

You will soon sit the NAPLAN test. Before you take this test there is something very important that you need to know:

This test does not assess all of the things that make you exceptional and unique.

The people who score these tests do not know that some of you love to sing, play an instrument, are good at drawing or can teach others how to use an App. They have not seen that some of you can dance elegantly or speak confidently about many topics to a large group of people. They do not know that your friends count on you to be there for them when they are sad. They do not know that you participate in sports and that when you smile you make everyone around you feel happy. They do not know that you help your Mum & Dad and that you play with your brother, sister or cousins. They do not know that you are caring, thoughtful and that every day you do your best. Because these attributes cannot be tested.

The scores you get from this test will tell you how you did on that day, but they will not tell you everything. They can't tell you that you have improved on something you once found difficult. They can't tell you that you brighten up your teacher's day. They can't tell you how amazingly special you are.

So come to school ready to do your best for the NAPLAN test and remember there is no one way to test all of the wonderful things that make you, YOU!

Partial Absences / Late Arrivals

Thank you to all of the parents who have been supportive in reducing the large number of unexplained absences by signing in their child/children if they are late arriving to school after the 8:45 am bell.

The school is legally required to keep accurate attendance records for all students. By signing in to school if late or signing out if leaving early, you ensure that your child's partial absence is recorded as explained. Any unsigned late arrivals are recorded as unexplained. All class rolls are legal documents so accuracy is essential. We appreciate that mornings are often a busy time for families and that unforeseen circumstances do arise. Learning Matters

Jesus reminds us: *Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called children of God.* (Mt. 5:9)

We commemorated **ANZAC Day** with a Liturgy on Wednesday 2nd May at 9am. Whilst we were not able to have this on the actual day, it was on a significant occasion. The French President, Emanuel Macron was visiting Sydney on this day and at 9am at the same time as our liturgy, he was attending an ANZAC ceremony at the War Memorial in Hyde Park.



This was to remember the centenary of the battle at Villers-Bretonneux (25th April 1918) in Northern France, where many brave Australian soldiers lost their lives taking this town back from the Germans. All year round, there are Australian flags flying everywhere in Villers-Bretonneux. The people have never forgotten and the sign on the school says: **DO NOT FORGET AUSTRALIA**. The children are taught about Australia and their school is named after the state of Victoria to honour the Victorian children who raised the money to rebuild the school after World War 1.

I visited Villers-Bretonneux in 2016 and left some small koalas at the school for the French children. Since then Monsieur Guillaume Fournet, a teacher of Year 3/4, has stayed in contact. The following is an extract from his email for ANZAC Day:



For the centenary of the Battle of Villers-Bretonneux and ANZAC Day, our class has produced a 25 minute long documentary called « DO NOT FORGET AUSTRALIA, the duty of remembrance in Villers-Bretonneux ».

The pupils and myself are extremely proud to present this film, which won the Sadlier-Stokes award in this centenary year! We will be given our prize on 25th April by an Australian personality: His Excellency, the Prime Minister, Malcolm Turnbull, just after the commemoration at the Memorial!!!

Watching the film, you will follow the pupils as they make moving discoveries: the Australian National Memorial, Adelaide Cemetery, the Franco-Australian Museum, the Victoria School...

The film is subtitled in English. This will allow us to highlight the work of our little French pupils of Villers-Bretonneux and participate in the duty of remembrance!

The Australian Memorial at Villers-Bretonneux has a new centre, originally planned by Tony Abbott when he was Prime Minister. It is named after Sir John Monash from Melbourne, considered Australia's greatest general. This centre was built to commemorate the centenary of the Australians fighting in France and was opened by Malcolm Turnbull on Anzac Day this year. Inside this memorial, the walls are built from beautiful Australian timbers.





In our ceremony at Chisholm, we prayed for peace in our families, our community, our country and our world, we also laid a wreath: We lay this wreath today to remember those who fought for our freedom. The circle reminds us of God's never-ending love and the green reminds us of life. Rosemary is a symbol of remembrance. We also watched the film made by the children in Villers-Bretonneux.

St Paul says: Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. (Phil. 4:4-8)
