Kindergarten 2019

For parents wishing to enrol their child in Kindergarten for 2019 applications are now being accepted. Interview times are being timetabled and conducted with the aim that they will be completed by the **end of this term**.

Uniform Policy - Hair

Despite consistent attempts to communicate the policy several students have continued to come to school with hair cuts that are shaved short on the sides and are a longer length on top. The school uniform policy requires haircuts to be of one even length.

A note will be sent home as a reminder where haircuts do not comply with the policy.

From the School Uniform Policy:

Hair is to be kept neat and tidy, off the collar, of consistent natural colour, of gradual even grade and all extremes of fashion are to be avoided. Some examples of "styles" that are unacceptable include: ridges, lines, undercuts, steps, bowl cuts, any excessive shaping with gel, and any shaving cuts.


Girls hair that is longer than shoulder length is to be tied back from the face. Hair is to be off the face and out of the eyes.

Ribbons, hair slides etc, if worn should be in the uniform fabric or maroon. Scrunchies are sold from the Uniform Shop.

Parents who ignore the school policy are sending a confusing message to their children and are asked to support the majority of parents who are complying with the request.

In addition, parents are reminded that the school sport socks are the only socks that should be worn with the school sports uniform and are readily available at the school uniform shop. Low cut ankle socks are not part of the school uniform.

If the uniform policy is a concern for any parents please feel free to contact the school to discuss the matter further. Thank you for your ongoing support with keeping our uniform standards high.





A reminder: All students who carry a mobile phone to and from school each day are asked to sign them into the school office on arrival to school each morning. They will collect them from the office when they have been dismissed from class after the final bell.
