#### **Hair Cuts**

Despite consistent attempts to communicate the policy several students have continued to come to school with haircuts that are shaved short on the sides and are a longer length on top. The school uniform policy requires haircuts to be of one even length.

A note will be sent home as a reminder where haircuts do not comply with the policy.

#### From the School Uniform Policy:

Hair is to be kept neat and tidy, off the collar, of consistent natural colour, of gradual even grade and all extremes of fashion are to be avoided. Some examples of "styles" that are unacceptable include: ridges, lines, undercuts, steps, bowl cuts, any excessive shaping with gel, and any shaving cuts.

Girls hair that is longer than shoulder length is to be tied back from the face. Hair is to be off the face and out of the eyes.

Ribbons, hair slides etc, if worn should be in the uniform fabric or maroon. Scrunchies are sold from the Uniform Shop.

I found it better to understand what he is actually learning and struggling with. Definitely a great way to do interviews.

Understanding what students are working on. Seeing what they have achieved. I also like that the students are evaluating where they are at looking forward to what they plan on achieving next.

It was great to be able to hear my child tell me about her progress.

It's a great opportunity for the child to take pride in and have responsibility for their own learning.

You can see how proud the students are to show their work and allows you to discuss it there and then.

I was a bit sceptical' being a teacher myself, but I really thought it was great. A real positive experience I'd like to try at my school.

It was great to have my daughter explain all the work she has done and how much she has improved.

Parents are able to experience a school-based conference being led by their child. Students will be able to gain confidence through showing their work / accomplishments.
