#### Kindergarten 2019



For parents wishing to enrol their child in Kindergarten for 2019 applications are about to close.

If you have any relatives or friends considering enrolling their child at Chisholm in 2019, now is the time to remind them to place their applications at the school office as there are limited places available. Enrolment forms are available from the school office during school office hours.

#### Uniform and Hair

A big thank you to all of our parents who are very supportive and continue to send their child/children to school dressed in the correct school uniform and with appropriate grooming, especially haircuts. This is a great way to instill self-respect and respect for the school community to which they belong.

An increasing a number of boys are coming to school with haircuts that are not even in length, are layered or sculptured. Parents are reminded of the following grooming requirements regarding hair.

Hair is to be kept neat and tidy, off the collar, of consistent natural colour, of gradual even grade and all extremes of fashion are to be avoided. Some examples of "styles" that are unacceptable include: ridges, lines, undercuts, steps, bowl cuts, any excessive shaping with gel, and any shaving cuts.

Girls hair that is longer than shoulder length is to be tied back from the face. Hair is to be off the face and out of the eyes.

Ribbons, hair slides etc, if worn should be in the uniform fabric or maroon. Scrunchies are sold from the Uniform Shop. We thank you for your ongoing understanding in not sending mixed messages to the children and supporting us in being consistent.

To assist in supporting any medical needs parents are reminded that it is important to communicate any changes in writing so both the class teachers and office staff are aware.

#### STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAY - STAFF PILGRIMAGE - 24th August

Why visit holy place of other faiths? In the Vatican II documents, there is a very important one called Nostra Aetate (Declaration on the Relation of the Church to Non-Christian Religions) which reminds us that we need to enter into dialogue with other faiths.

"Our first task in approaching another people, another culture, another religion, is to take off our shoes, for the place we are approaching is holy. Else we may find ourselves treading on another's dream. More serious still, we may forget ... that God was there before our arrival." Max Warren

"The places of pilgrimage have marked a kind of geography of faith, that is, they make visible, almost tangible, how our forefathers encountered the living God, how HE did not withdraw after creation or after the time of Jesus Christ." Pope Benedict XVI.

Chisholm staff went on a pilgrimage to the Great Synagogue, Sydney, St Mary's Cathedral, Sydney and the Gallipoli Mosque at Auburn. These are the great monotheistic faiths that originate with Abraham. What we have in common: Abraham - the founding father; Jerusalem – a holy city; the Scriptures – similarities; pilgrimage – to holy places; the unspoken name – Yahweh, Allah. We prayed at each holy place.


It is dedicated to Mary because it is Mary who invites all who enter to seek God. Mary is the intermediary between God and humanity,
