Medical Updates

Over time circumstances regarding medical plans, medication or medical conditions may change for your child/children. To assist in supporting any medical needs parents are reminded that it is important to communicate any changes in writing so both the class teachers and office staff are aware.

Medication Policy

Some children attending schoo	I need	medication t	o control	medical	conditions:
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Parents should supply -

☐ Specific written permission (forms are available from our website or the school office)

Form 1 Notification and request for the administration of medication during school hours

Form 2 Medical Advice to school completed by the prescribing doctor verifying medical condition and treatment.

Prescription medicine should be in a prescription container which gives the name of the child, the dosage and time the medication is to be given and the name of the prescribing doctor.

Please note:

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Children who are sick should not come to school.

□ Children are not allowed to keep medication whilst at school – it must be handed in to the office and will be put under lock and key.

□ It would be best if essential medication be given at home before or after your child comes to school.

Children who take regular medication need to complete the permission forms and are required to provide an Action Plan.

In addition to the Policy

Parents/Carers need to ensure that all medication kept at school for their child has a **valid expiry date**. Medication past its expiry date **cannot** be administered.

ARE YOU MOVING IN 2019?

To estimate enrolments for 2019, it would be appreciated if the school could be notified of any children who may be leaving Chisholm at the end of the year from grades other than Year 6.

Please note that under the School Fee Policy as set out by the Catholic Education Office Parramatta:

"A terms notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment, that is, the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance."

Kiss & Ride

There are clear council parking restrictions in the Kiss & Ride area that will be enforced by council rangers and police patrols. Please note:-



The Kiss & Ride area is a NO PARKING ZONE between: 8.00am - 9.00am & 2.30pm - 3.30pm
This Means You Cannot Park Your Car And Wait

When using this zone you have a 2 minute window to drop off or pick up and you need to remain with your vehicle. Staff on duty are there to assist by supervising the children and having them ready to pick up in the afternoon.

Parents/Carers are reminded that Chisholm is a **SAFE HONEST RESPECTFUL** learning community so speaking respectfully at all times is a community expectation.

In the event of traffic build up staff are expected to ask drivers to drive around the block so buses and traffic can keep moving.

The main traffic thins out from 3.15pm so parents might like to consider a slightly later pick up. Teacher supervision concludes at 3.30pm.

To facilitate a smooth Kiss and Ride experience, please have your A4 sign displayed on your car windscreen. This enables teachers on duty to recognise the family and announce the name to the children.

PBL - Project based learning

What are students be doing in project-based learning time?

Essentially, PBL time includes the learning in any curriculum area where the students are addressing relevant content, acquiring new skills, discovering something new, and exploring the possibilities. Teachers are supporting students in making connections between their learning in different curriculum areas and identifying how this learning can be applied to solving problems and answering questions. PBL is an incredibly powerful experience for students.

Allocated PBL time might involve a range of different activities such as:

- independent research
- gathering information
- interviewing key stakeholders or community members
- consulting with an expert
- using technology to connect with stakeholders or experts beyond the classroom
- designing experiments
- sharing ideas and collaborating
- ideating, prototyping and testing designs and products
- reflecting on findings
- critically analysing results
- preparing to present findings or products to judges or an audience
- evaluating and refining work
- soliciting advice and feedback.



Year 3 and 6 Kitchen Gardens PBL

This week's focus in Year 3 was companion planting. Children read a text and watched a YouTube clip to inform them about the topic. The information was discussed and ideas raised were clarified

It was exciting to see Year 3's seedlings planted into the brand new garden beds on Friday and the sun finally shining long enough to get the plants in. Students used their measurement skills to plant the seedlings at the correct depth and distance apart.

The children were filled with enthusiasm and excitement. They will enjoy watching their garden grow and waiting for the vegetables that will emerge in the weeks to come.

The Year 6 gardens are well on the way. Seedlings were planted before the holidays. The children will focus this term on food preparation, learning about natural pesticides and have already tested and learned about soil alkalinity and acidity.

Learning Matters


Kindergarten Science

Ashton: We tried to make the car roll fast. We made our stand up big.


Anabelle: We made our ramp but then we took the straws off because it wouldn't work. This made the car go faster!





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National Apology to Victims and Survivors of Institutional Child Sexual Abuse

A reflection for all the agencies, ministries, parishes, clergy, staff and volunteers of the Diocese of Parramatta for 11am on Monday 22 October 2018

This reflection is to acknowledge and recognise the importance of the National Apology to Victims and Survivors of Institutional Child Sexual Abuse being delivered today by the Prime Minister of Australia, Scott Morrison.

Today is a very important day when the prime minister will say sorry to all those people in Australia who, in the past, were hurt as children in places where they were supposed to be loved and cared for, including our churches and schools.

The prime minister will not only be saying sorry to the people for the hurt they have suffered, but also to acknowledge and recognise their courage in telling their stories.

With their voice, these brave people were able speak out and ask for help. It has meant that many of those who caused the harm have been brought to justice, and other children have been saved from harm. It has also helped us as a Catholic community to learn from the past so that this does not happen again.

The Diocese of Parramatta, including our parishes, schools, ministries, agencies, staff, clergy and volunteers are joining together today to acknowledge the National Apology, to remember the children who were hurt, and to give thanks to those who found courage and strength in speaking out.

We stand together to acknowledge the harm caused by those within Catholic institutions who sexually abused children or responded to abuse in a way that was ineffective or inadequate, and to honour the immense courage of those who found their voice and spoke the truth which saved others from harm.
