Hair Cuts

It has been noticed that on the return to school several students have come to school with haircuts that are shaved short on the sides and are a longer length on top. The school uniform policy **requires haircuts to be of one even length.**

A note will be sent home as a reminder where haircuts do not comply with the policy.

From the School Uniform Policy:

Hair is to be kept neat and tidy, off the collar, of consistent natural colour, of gradual even grade and all extremes of fashion are to be avoided. Some examples of "styles" that are unacceptable include: ridges, lines, undercuts, steps.

Girls hair that is longer than shoulder length is to be tied back from the face. Hair is to be off the face and out of the eyes.

Ribbons, hair slides etc, if worn should be in the uniform fabric or maroon. Scrunchies are sold from the Uniform Shop.

GRADE / PARENT INFORMATION MEETINGS

At Chisholm we value and promote open lines of communication between school and home. We encourage teachers and parents to be in regular communication by making an appointment to discuss any aspects of your child's learning and development.

These appointments can be made at any time that the need arises in addition to other formal opportunities during the year such as student led conferences.

This year Chisholm will be holding Grade/ Parent meetings in week 4.

The purpose of these meetings is for grade teachers to

- Outline the structures and routines that will be in place to support the learning during the year.
- Provide a brief over view of the learning journey being planned for the year.
- Share strategies being implemented to support student needs
- Answer questions you may have relating to the coming school year

These meetings are scheduled in the evening to allow all parents to attend. Sessions will be held at different times to cater for parents who may need to attend more than one session. Each grade session will be specific to their learning group.

A note with dates and times will be sent home this week for you to plan your attendance.

PARENT PICK UP AT CHISHOLM

Parents are reminded that there are 3 designated areas for waiting to collect children in the afternoon. These areas are

- 1. The undercover court area / seats.
- 2. The hand ball court area / seats.
- 3. The parent retreat area.

Thank you to all our parents who always assist the safe and smooth dismissal by following school procedures.

Parents are asked to not wait at the school gates to pick up children to ensure that every child leaves with the correct adult

To support child protection protocols, parents are asked to refrain from;

- Waiting outside classroom doors.
- Accessing children's school bags before the bell.
- Accessing verandahs near year 1 & 2.
- Waiting near either of the toilet blocks including the silver seats near the senior toilet block and the uniform shop near the infant's toilets.
- Looking into classroom windows before classes are dismissed.
- Wandering around the grounds.

The best way we have of knowing who enters the school grounds at dismissal time is if adults are gathered in the designated areas.

In addition, parents are advised, the routine for afternoon access is that school gates will be open at 2.55pm. This allows 5 minutes waiting time before pickup. Adults needing to gain access before this time can do so via the office as per usual.

Your ongoing support in keeping ourselves and our children safe is appreciated and valued.

SUPERVISION IN THE MORNINGS

Playground supervision begins at 8.15am and concludes at 3.30pm. Please note that children who arrive at school before this time will be unsupervised and for this reason we request most strongly that they do not come to school before 8.15am. Children are not to be on the premises outside the stated school hours.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

This will be held every Sunday, during the 9am Mass starting Sunday, 17th February 2019. Parents, if you have children in Kindergarten through to Year 6, this brief liturgy is an excellent introduction to participation in the rituals of the Mass and understanding the Word of God. The scriptures of the day are presented in a simple and interactive way geared to meet the needs and understanding of the child. Parents are always welcome to accompany their child, check out what it's all about, and meet the wonderful team of volunteer prayer leaders.

During the 9am Sunday Mass last weekend, volunteer facilitators, who will be helping the children to better understand the Sunday Liturgy of the Word, were commissioned. This helps children grow in faith by hearing the Word of God at their level of understanding.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION - EUCHARIST

If you wish your child to receive the Sacrament of Eucharist, preparation is beginning shortly. Your child needs to be in Year 3 or above and baptised Catholic to begin this initiation into the Church. The program is parish based, family centred and school supported. The program begins with a Parent meeting either at Chisholm (Tuesday 26^{th} February at 7.30pm) or at St Matthew's (Wednesday 27^{th} February at 7.30pm). The First Eucharist Masses are on Sunday 26^{th} May at 11.00am and 1.00pm and on Sunday 2^{nd} June at 11.00am and 1.00pm. To enrol in the program, parents must attend one of the parent meetings.

KISS & RIDE

There are clear council parking restrictions in the Kiss & Ride area that will be enforced by council rangers and police patrols. Please note:-

The Kiss & Ride area is a NO PARKING ZONE between: 8.00am - 9.00am & 2.30pm - 3.30pm
THIS MEANS YOU CANNOT PARK YOUR CAR AND WAIT

When using this zone you have a **2 minute** window to drop off or pick up and you need to remain with your vehicle. Staff on duty are there to assist by supervising the children and having them ready to pick up in the afternoon.

Parents/Carers are reminded that Chisholm is a **SAFE HONEST RESPECTFUL** learning community so speaking respectfully at all times is a community expectation.

In the event of traffic build up staff are expected to ask drivers to drive around the block so buses and traffic can keep moving.

The main traffic thins out from 3.15pm so parents might like to consider a slightly later pick up. Teacher supervision concludes at 3.30pm when any remaining children can be collected at the office. They are supervised at all times.

To facilitate a smooth Kiss and Ride experience, please have an A4 sign clearly labelled with the family name displayed on your car windscreen. This enables teachers on duty to recognise the family and announce the name to the children.

Learning Matters

At Chisholm we encourage the students to be **Safe**, **Honest and Respectful Learners**.

This term, students in all grades will be learning about and discussing what being SAFE, HONEST and RESPECTFUL LEARNERS looks like, sounds like and feels like at Chisholm.

As classes begin to establish their routines in their new learning spaces, these values will be encouraged on a daily basis. To promote these values at Chisholm, we have a school based Positive Behaviour System comprising of *Chisholm Cards* which rewards students who are demonstrating these values.

Our Chisholm Card Award system works as follows:

Chisholm cards are awarded to students by their teachers for good decisions regarding their learning and behaviour.

- 5 cards = **Teacher's Award.**
- 10 cards = **Stage Leader's Award.**
- 15 cards = **Assistant Principal's Award.**
- 20 cards = Principal's Award and Badge.

Teacher awards are presented by the class teacher in the classroom.

Children will be presented with the other awards at the Monday morning assembly for their commitment towards being safe, honest, respectful learners.

Congratulations to all of our students who have been Safe, Honest, and Respectful Learners.



Summer of Learning Ignite Day Theme

Each term at Chisholm, we begin with a theme that stimulates the children's imagination and therefore becomes an exciting topic that encourages discussion and student engagement in their learning.
