#### FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

#### Parent Pick Up at Chisholm

Parents are reminded that there are 3 designated areas for waiting to collect children in the afternoon. These areas are

- 1. The undercover court area / seats.
- 2. The hand ball court area / seats.
- 3. The parent retreat area.

Thank you to all our parents who always assist the safe and smooth dismissal by following school procedures.

To support child protection protocols, parents are asked to refrain from;

- Waiting outside classroom doors.
- Accessing children's school bags before the bell.
- Accessing verandahs near year 1 & 2.
- Waiting near either of the toilet blocks including the silver seats near the senior toilet block and the uniform shop near the infant's toilets.
- Looking into classroom windows before classes are dismissed.
- Wandering around the grounds.

The best way we have of knowing who enters the school grounds at dismissal time is if adults are gathered in the designated areas.

In addition, parents are advised, the routine for afternoon access is that school gates will be open at 2.55pm. This allows 5 minutes waiting time before pickup. Adults needing to gain access before this time can do so via the office as per usual.

#### Years 3-4 Soccer Gala Day Coaches Required







# Learning Matters

Developing the quality of student writing through the use of sophisticated vocabulary, is a goal we have been working on at Chisholm. The article below has some great suggestions on ways you could help to build your Child's writing skills.

# 10 Tips to Help Build Your Child's Writing Skills

Writing helps communicate thoughts, complete tasks and demonstrate the mastery of a skill. It is an integral part of every elementary school student's education.

# 10 Tips for Building Writing Skills at Home:

1. Provide a variety of materials for writing. Fun pens and pretty papers can be a great motivational tool.



- 2. Create a space in your home for writing that is free from distractions.
- 3. Choose strong vocabulary words to learn at home for the week. Use these words in your daily oral vocabulary and written work. Words such as "obstacles" and "curious" are a great start. See if your child can use them both in a written story.
- 4. Integrate core academic area writing at home. Do a science project together and then write about the process or results.
- 5. Encourage writing for a variety of purposes. Your child could make a shopping list, write a fictional story or send a letter.
  - 6. Use technology to improve writing. Encourage your child to send an e-mail to a friend or publish a story online.
- 7. Allow your child to observe you writing on your own. Be a good role model and smile while you are doing it, too! Take time to share your writing with him or her and talk about how you use writing in your personal and professional life. Show a variety of different written work such as a written letter, business communication or journal page.
- 8. Connect writing with your child's passion.
- 9. Celebrate writing in a variety of ways. You could:
  - Tape completed stories to the refrigerator.
- 10. Last, but not least, it is important to provide time to write daily. In order for writing skills to improve, students must spend time writing. Add it to your family's daily routine and build it into the schedule. This will help your writer to practice and gain confidence in his or her writing.
