Semester 1 Reports /Student Led Conferences

Over the past weeks class teachers have been working hard to complete your child's Semester 1 report. Student reports are scheduled to be sent home on Thursday 27th June, in week 9. On this occasion, Year 6 reports will go home on Monday 24th June.

Grade letters will be going home today in preparation for Student led conferences. The letters will include details of the arrangements for your child's grade, teacher availability and details of how to make your online booking.

Our student led conferences are a great way to be involved and share in your child's learning journey as well as work in partnership with your child's teacher and the school. With this in mind it is an expectation that all parents make the time to attend.

Community Safety and Afternoon Dismissal

Afternoon school dismissal is a busy time in any school and here at Chisholm the exit of nearly five hundred students and large numbers of parents has its challenges.

It is important to remember that it is each person's responsibility to keep themselves and others safe at all times.

Parents are asked to help by

- Being patient, calm and considerate of others
- Observing the school designated pick up areas
- Spreading Kiss & Ride pick up times between 3.00pm 3.30pm
- Strictly obeying road rules
- Using the pedestrian crossing
- Considering neighbours

Parents and Carers are reminded that there are 3 designated areas for waiting to collect children in the afternoon. These areas are:

- 1. The undercover court area / seats.
- 2. The hand ball court area / seats.
- 3. The parent retreat area.

To support child protection protocols, parents are asked to refrain from;

- Waiting outside classroom doors.
- Accessing children's school bags before the bell.
- Accessing verandahs near year 1 & 2.
- Waiting near either of the toilet blocks including the silver seats near the senior toilet block and the uniform shop near the infant's toilets.
- Looking into classroom windows before classes are dismissed.
- Wandering around the grounds.

In addition, parents are advised, the routine for afternoon access is that school gates will be open at 2.55pm. This allows 5 minutes waiting time before pickup. Adults needing to gain access before this time can do so via the office as per usual.

Your ongoing support in keeping ourselves and our children safe is appreciated.

Please advise the school through the **Skoolbag App** if your child will be absent from school.



CCG MEETING



Technology is a big part of our lives, and coding is a skill our students will need to develop as they grow up in a digital world.

complete a task. They practise working together and listening to each other. This is helping to develop their social skills and task management skills.




This year, students in Years 1-6 have been using Ozobots to:
