KINDERGARTEN 2020 - FINAL WEEKS TO ENROL



For parents wishing to enrol their child in Kindergarten for 2020 applications will be closing soon.

If you have any relatives or friends considering enrolling in 2020, now is the time to their child at Chisholm remind them to place their applications at the school office, as places are filling quickly.

Enrolment forms are available from the school office.

Supervision in the morning

Playground supervision begins at 8.15am and concludes at 3.30pm. Please note that children who arrive at school before this time will be unsupervised and for this reason, we request most strongly that they do not come to school before 8.15am. Children are not to be on the premises outside the stated school hours.

Community Safety and Afternoon Dismissal

Afternoon school dismissal is a busy time in any school and here at Chisholm the exit of nearly five hundred students and large numbers of parents has its challenges.

It is important to remember that it is always each person's responsibility to keep themselves and others safe.

Parents are asked to help by

- Being patient, calm and considerate of others
- Observing the school designated pick up areas
- Spreading Kiss & Ride pick up times between 3.00pm 3.30pm
- Strictly obeying road rules
- Using the pedestrian crossing
- Considering neighbours



Children up to 10 years of age should be supervised around traffic and should hold an adult's hand when crossing the road.

Parents and Carers are reminded that there are 2 designated areas for waiting to collect children in the afternoon. These areas are:

- 1. The undercover court area / seats.
- 2. The hand ball court area / seats.

To support child protection protocols, parents are asked to refrain from:

- Waiting outside classroom doors.
- Accessing children's school bags before the bell.
- Accessing verandahs near year 1 & 2.
- Waiting near either of the toilet blocks including the silver seats near the senior toilet block and the uniform shop near the infant's toilets.
- Looking into classroom windows before classes are dismissed.
- Wandering around the grounds.

In addition, parents are advised, the routine for afternoon access is that school gates will be open at 2.55pm. This allows 5 minutes waiting time before pickup

Your ongoing support in keeping ourselves and our children safe is appreciated.

Thank you to the parents that have sent in your feedback, we are still open to receiving more feedback to take to the CCG meeting next Thursday night.

Just some clarifications that were queried in the feedback in case other parents have the same assumptions.

- 1.) The items we have put forward (Long Jump Pit, Outdoor classroom, toss ball tower) ALL fit in the budget. It isn't an either/or case and all items combined will cost \$30k.
- 2.) The long jump pit would be utilised throughout the year during school sports lessons, not just the once at the athletic carnival.
- 3.) Please understand we have had numerous meetings this year including every CCG meeting where new ideas were invited, shared and discussed in length from anyone that attended these open meetings. This isn't what we are looking for at this point. We have researched, & put forward the decision to the school and the school has asked for feedback on the above ideas before making their final decisions
- 4.) Lastly, please be kind with your responses. We know that we can't make everyone happy and we know that there will be some people that disagree with the items we have put forward, but we as a collective group made what we feel is the best decision with the information we had presented at the time.
